

Sesuvium portulacastrum Pourpier de mer Family : Aïzoaceae

This small, fat, creeping plant can form dense vegetation carpets.

It is used as a refuge for striped knitwear which finds there a shelter against the rays of the sun.

Its creeping stems, often reddish, spread out in a star shape. These thick leaves are waterlogged to resist the salty environment and can turn red in hypersaline environment. The small solitary flowers of color mauve or white open only very little time.
